- Powder River Panel raffle, Amanda Barrett reported that over \$15,000 had been turned in, with Siskiyou County selling the most, with Rita March selling over \$2,000. K. C. Jeffery won the panels Sat. night at banquet.
- A special thank you was given to Judy Ahmann and Anna Reed for chair-

ing the Region VI Silent Auction package at ANCW mid-year, when a Napa Experience was featured. ANCW made twice the usual dollars. CCW won the WIGGY contest, thanks to increase in membership and all activity reports turned in. President Sheila encouraged all CCW members to become ANCW members, as a national presence in the beef industry.

NEW BUSINESS:

- ANCW Update was presented by President Melanie Fowle, about moving the organization from the 1950's to the 21st Century. ANCW.org is the new website. The Webinars are a way to give value to the membership, and they are using hot topics, such as veal and sustainable beef. The Webinars are furthering-education and business-enrichment. The National Beef Ambassador program has been dropped since the Operating Committee would not help fund it. Instead, ANCW will have a Collegiate Team, with five finalist, offering scholarships with industry partners. ANCW is collecting our dues and billing the membership. A reception for the Collegiates will be in President Melanie's suite in San Diego, on Tuesday evening, 6:30-7:30 p.m

- junior winners will be chosen. One each from Northern, Central and Southern districts of CCW.
