TCCW Board Meeting Minutes

April 6, 2017 • Farm Bureau Building

President Jeanne Smith called the meeting to order at 6:30. Flag salute and Creed. President Jeanne asked for a moment of silence for those members who have lost family members in recent weeks.

Approval of Minutes: Darci Richesen moved, seconded by Cathy Tobin. Motion carried.

Report Financial: Rene Ewing reported balances: Cathy Tobin moved, seconded by Shelley Macdonald to approve the financials. Motion carried.

Budget Information: Linda Borrer reported TCCW could eliminate the budget person. A budget committee (4-6) could handle this process. Basically it is a checks and balance oversee. Noted would be on the next Board of Directors agenda.

• *Sunshine:* none • *Scholarship:* Cathy Tobin reported that the TCCW half of the Winter Dinner auction was \$10,245.01. TCA and TCCW agree that Rene Ewing handle the dinner money and Linda Borrer handle the auction money. This will make the accounting process and proceeds clearer. It was noted that \$1,500.00 goes towards the beef ambassador 2017-18 program. Current scholarship committee will have \$8,500.00 to work with this 2017 award year. Scholarship applications are due May 5, 2017.

- 5. Cattlemen's Field Day:** Cathy Tobin thanked all for bring desserts. About 80 dinners served. Had kids activities/events and the adult horse events.
- 6. Kelley Mouton request:** Kelley had helped Siskiyou County CattleWomen on a classroom presentation and they requested information on the earth day program that TCCW gives. Jeanne Smith will follow up on this.

- 2. Tehama County Library donation:** \$500.00 is a budgeted donation however; need a MOU to be drawn with Library and TCCW. MOU will be done and donation given at May meeting.
